the process by which businesses or other organizations develop international influence or start operating on an international scale.

costs generated by producers but carried by society as a whole.

an economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state.

a change in global or regional climate patterns, in particular a change apparent from the mid to late 20th century onwards and attributed largely to the increased levels of atmospheric carbon dioxide produced by the use of fossil fuels.

is a measure of the social, cultural and economic relatedness or connectivity between two places.

a description of how a place is related to other places.

the presence in or introduction into the environment of a substance or thing that has harmful or poisonous effects.

a country that is less developed economically than most others, with little industry and little money spent on education, health care, etc.

focuses primarily on the income inequalities across states or across individuals in the world.

a gas that contributes to the greenhouse effect by absorbing infrared radiation, e.g., carbon dioxide and chlorofluorocarbons.

are the industrialized capitalist countries on which periphery countries and semi-periphery countries depend.

the industrializing, mostly capitalist countries which are positioned between the periphery and core countries.

are those that are less developed than the semi-periphery and core countries. These countries usually receive a disproportionately small share of global wealth.
